


EE892 to EE894 Transition Guide

Use of the EE894 CO₂ Module Generation

Overview.

As a success story in the EE89x CO₂ modules timeline, the EE892 is being replaced by the EE894 after more than 10 years on the market. Switching to the EE894 offers some substantial and crucial advantages:

- A further development of the basic measured variable in the CO₂ range through improvements in the electronic processing
- Pressure compensation of the measured data
- Humidity, temperature and pressure are additional measurands available at the digital interface
- Downward compatibility

General

The EE892 is reaching its End of Life and will not be shipped after 31.12.2021 (Last-Time-Buy 31.10.2021). This document is a guide to replacing the EE892 with the EE894 and highlights important differences to consider in design processes.

Package Design Differences

The existing dimensions were taken over unchanged and allow the best possible exchange. It is only necessary to consider the details of the edge card connectors in connection with tightly fitting housing guides or equivalent.

In addition to the standard, there is also an EE894 compact version which offers further advantages in terms of size.



Communication Compatibility

Both modules are addressed via the E2 bus protocol whereas the EE894 also contains an I²C communication protocol. Find an overview of the different communication options as described in Table 3 and Table 4.
